Best Practices for the Community Bible Reading Plan

Remember what it's about

The point of this plan is to know and love Jesus more, not to know and love the Bible more. The entire Bible points to Jesus, and He came to fulfill all of it. Look for Jesus as you read (the resources we share will help with this) and ask Him to help you understand what you read and live it out.

Set a Habit

If you already have time set aside to read Scripture, that's great! Do what has been working for you. If you are just starting this habit, or have experienced a schedule change that necessitates you change what you've been doing, try to start a new habit. Pick a time and a place that you will spend time with Jesus every day. It doesn't have to be long or fancy. Ten minutes should be sufficient to thoughtfully read through your passage every day and spend a few minutes in prayer. You can plan this to go along with other things you do everyday, like taking a shower, driving, or exercising. And on that note...

Rethink how you read

If you need to listen to Scripture every day instead of read, go for it! The Streetlights Audio Bible on Spotify is a great resource, as is the audio feature on the YouVersion Bible app.

Pray as you read

Reading Scripture is more than just about learning or studying, it is truly about meeting with God. He speaks to us through Scripture and in praying His words back to Him, we are joining our hearts with His. We have intentionally kept this reading plan at a manageable pace so that we'll also have time to read slowly and pray through Scripture as we read.

If you get behind

Don't try to catch up first! That makes it really easy to get discouraged and quit! Just pick back up with the day you're restarting and start the habit again.
